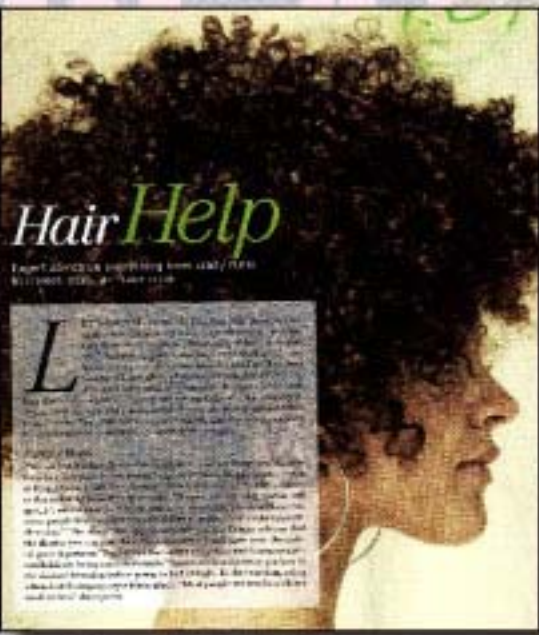




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Straight Talk

Think straight hair is easy to handle? Not always, especially if your mane is as thick as yours. When tangles, frizz and volume can be created with the help of styling tools, high quality products and the right haircut. "If you want fullness, shampoo with volume-building products and only use conditioner on your ends to not weigh your hair down," says Langel. Then, use a brush to smooth and the remaining 10 percent, moving hair in the opposite direction of its usual style. So, if you wear your hair pulled out the left, blow-dry to the right.
